This half term U1 have got involved in muck, mess and mixtures!


It has been such a busy term. Students in Upper 1 got creative and made their own tie dyed t-shirts and even created some giant abstract art.


They didn't stop there, they also made their own wax crayons and tried out sewing on the sewing machine.
